## Colonialism and resistance: social history and current events

- This is a huge subject about which much could be said
  - and much is said by many anthropologists
  - who see the impact of colonialism and people's responses to it (often resistance of one sort or another) as being one of the major features of recent and modern cultures
  - and one of the most important things that must be understood in order to comprehend many cultures
  - some people would argue that this is one of the main themes of cultural anthropology today
- We will take the readings as background for globalization
  - since we are running out of class time, I will let these readings speak for themselves
  - but please don't neglect them they are all the more important to read because I will not amplify them in class or in these notes.
- General points:
  - Colonialism is the context for much of the interaction between cultures in the last few centuries
    - must understand it to understand:
      - development and functioning of many cultures
        - both colonized
        - and colonizing
      - interactions of cultures
  - it is also the context for much ethnography up to very recently, and sometimes still
    - affects the goals, interests, and methods of anthropologists
    - affects how anthropologists are received by people in colonized cultures
  - context for explanations of cultures and changes in them in terms of systems (Middleton)
